## Special Congregational Meeting Sunday, September 23, 2018

The meeting will discuss how to proceed to meet our financial obligations through January 31, 2019. Based upon current projections, we will run out of cash in mid-November. Following the finance committee's recommendation, the Council has moved to ask the congregation to vote on the following motion:

The council will hold a congregational meeting asking for the authority to withdraw funds from Fund A of our investment bond - above and beyond the dividends and interest as of January 31, 2019. This amount will not exceed and will be up to the current valve of our initial investment of 218.7349 shares leads the original cost of \$256,456.




