

#### **Notes from Pastor Inglett**

We are one month into our internship process with Vicar Lily and Faith Lutheran. I have heard directly from you that you are excited about this new ministry and having Vicar Lily with you. I have also heard indirectly, out in the community, that you see this opportunity as exciting and a breath of fresh air. One of my observations is that you are all doing a good job at making sure that Lay leadership and involvement does not drop off. A couple of reasons this is important is that Lily is half time and she is a student. The other reason this is important is that you are setting the standard and example of a new model of ministry that is lay person centered. In this new partnership the questions we will be asking are what is it that you absolutely need a pastor to do and what areas of ministry are best served by trained and empowered lay people.

Please know that this is one of the things that I am focusing on and learning about was we move forward. As we do move forward, I will be looking at where does leadership need to be developed at Faith Lutheran so that mission and ministry can effectively live and share the Good News of God's Kingdom. At our staff meeting on July 2<sup>nd</sup> I asked for a list of things that Faith Lutheran does in the community. I am asking that from all of you. It is important for us to discover first what is it that we are doing in the community. The second piece will be to ask what are the present hopes and hurts in our community? From there we will see how our gifts for mission and ministry can intersect with the realities of our community.

Rebecca and Vicar Lily are in the midst of planning how we will nurture the faith life of our youth and adults through our educational programming. Your worship committee has put together an ambitious schedule to nurture the worship life of Faith Lutheran. Done well, both of these will build the relationships within the congregation. What we need to look at together is the service piece of congregational life. The purpose of nurturing faith and building relationships is to empower people to go out and share this good news.

In our time together my hope is that we keep these three foci always in front of us as path to follow and a direction to pull towards. Faith, Relationships and Service.

Quick reminder about feedback to Vicar Lily and the role of the Lay Internship committee. The feedback you give to Vicar Lily about any of her work and/or her sermons and worship leadership is limited to what you would normally give to any Pastor that preaches at Faith Lutheran. From my experience this is generally "thank you, I appreciated your message," or something very specific that touched you, spiritually, emotionally or personally.

I doubt any of you say to an ordained Pastor or supply Pastor "you need to ..., you could improve by ... when I give a speech I ..." If you wouldn't say it to a guest pastor do not say it to Vicar Lily. Here is why. You are at church to worship. None of us are at worship to judge and evaluate. Secondly, the evaluation of Vicar Lily's preaching and worship leadership is the responsibility of the Lay Internship committee and myself, as her supervisor. Periodically, people in the congregation will have opportunity and responsibility to fill out sermon evaluations. The Lay internship committee will hand these out and collect them as they go about their feedback process. If something that is preached or done by Vicar Lily that does hurt or offend you shaking hands at the end of the church is not the place for that to be voiced. The more effective way to do this is to wait 24 hours, think about it and if you are still upset ask speak to Vicar Lily at some later time if you would like me, as her supervisor, to be present I would welcome that.

We are learning as we form this model of ministry. My hope is to provide some clear boundaries and expectations right off the bat. As a reminder, most Tuesday mornings at about 10:00 a.m. we will have open staff meetings. These times are your opportunity to help us work together. Also, it lets you know when I am available to you on a consistent basis.
