The Church Council voted on Monday, June 15th and Pastor Dick and I agreed to work with them to slowly reopen the church. We will start with outdoor services through the Sundays of July, weather permitting. The services will be similar to the virtual, and printed ones but the music will be played from a recording, communion will be distributed at the end of the service, as a drive up and we will keep our 6ft distance. And as some might not be ready to gather just yet, you can join us "live" online. If we cannot be outside due to weather, I will still have the services "livestreamed" online for viewing, where I will be inside the church with one other to videotape, and you will watch at home as we have been, as we cannot all be together inside just yet. Since we will meet in the parking lot for the service we will start at 9am and keep it short to beat the heat.

Additionally throughout July we are allowing church sponsored groups of amounts of 10 and under to meet again, as long as they can keep the 6ft distance and clean up after themselves.

We will have more specifics regarding safety and expectations for cleaning in the small indoor gatherings that will be displayed in our gathering space. Next to that will be a generous donation of masks, if anyone needs one. As we continue to live within a pandemic please proceed with caution, please make educated and safe decisions, please reach out if you need anything! So much love to you all in these crazy moments as we continue to find beautiful ways to show up for our community. Looking forward to seeing one another again!

A Message from Pastor Inglett



Congregational Conversation on Race Relationships from our Christian Identity Report

Approximately 20 people attended our conversation about race relationships on June 4 at 7:00 p.m.. The people who attended reported that they were primarily there to listen. This was the case for the entire evening. People were able to share insights, painful moments, confusion and personal lack of awareness and they were heard and respected. That goal of the gathering was met because of the integrity and vulnerability of the participants.

After sharing who we were and why we were present the conversation moved to sharing some basic ground rules and a reminder of our Christian identity rooted in baptism. We came together first and foremost as the baptized children of God who among other things were promised to be taught and given the opportunity to, according to our Baptism – "Strive for justice and peace in all the earth." We also have the shared identity that we claimed when at our confirmation, we promised to "Strive for justice and peace in all the earth." Finally, people were reminded that they called a pastor and in that call document you said the pastor "shall speak for Justice on behalf of the poor and oppressed."

As we shared our past and formative experiences that inform how we think, feel, and behave today in connection to race relationships the vast majority of us realized we have been isolated and insulted from direct and personal interaction with African Americans. Most of what we shared was anecdotal or limited experiences. What we perceive about race in our community and nation is what we have been presented or taught not what we know and can speak of with any authority or authenticity. This was a helpful realization for nearly all of us. We do not know enough to even ask the right questions or move in any direction.

In regard to how our Christian faith informs what we think, feel and do we were nearly all in agreement on two things. First, that our faith calls us to forgive and love others as Jesus modeled forgiveness and love for the outcast, different than us, oppressed, the other. Second, we realized that we must start by examining ourselves and specifically our sinful prejudice, our bias, our racism. I found both of these insights refreshing. Forgive, love, and confession of sin are pretty basic to our Lutheran Christian faith that we all might take a little more time to practice.

Finally, we discussed where we might go from here? At least half of the participants said we need to continue the conversation with a more specific focus. Second, we need to be educated on what it is to be African-American in our present culture and time. More than half of the participants agreed that it would be helpful to partner with our sister, urban congregation Midvale Lutheran in Madison.


Racism and Christian Faith 101

Follow-up to our Conversation about Race relationships at Sugar Creek Lutheran as informed by our Christian Faith. As you read in the report from our June conversation one of the things that the participants wanted to move to next is education about Racism in our culture.

To meet that request I am offering a Racism basics workshop on Wednesday evening July 15 at 6:00 p.m. I have to tell you this workshop that I am leading is not out of some expertise I possess or training I have had. I will be researching and then learning along with you about topics such as race, racism, prejudice, stereotyping, implicit bias, white privilege, white supremacy (which by the way is not what I thought it was) and what it means to be white in America.

The way I look at this learning is that I have never examined who I am as a white person in our rural Wisconsin reality. This is the way I am approaching all of these subjects. First, I want to strip away my defenses and become aware. Second, I would like to have a common language and agree about common terms so that we can actually have a common dialogue. This workshop is for you if you want to learn, look at yourself and who you are and how you are in the world. This workshop will not be a defense or judgement of anything. It will be us wading in and getting to know the very water we live in and have rarely examined. As a very wise Greek philosopher (Socrates) once said the unexamined life is not worth living. I want my life to be worth living and I invite those who feel the same about their life to join me.

We will meet outside of the Sugar Creek fellowship hall doors at 6:00 p.m. on July 15. Face masks are required and you are encouraged to bring your own lawn chair. Hope to see you there for an evening of learning and growth.


