# Communion Procedures for Indoor Worship

Stay seated until dismissed by an usher. Ushers will dismiss one group at a time. Please stay at each station until invited to proceed to the next station.

Station #1: The side door of the sanctuary.

• Do not enter the gathering space until the next station is open.

Station #2: The bulletin stand.

• Remove your mask and wait to receive communion.

Station #3: The tall white table.

 Remain at this table to fully receive communion. Leave the plate at the table, place the used cup in the wastebasket, and put back on your mask.

Station #4: The exit doors.

 Please exit the building after you receive communion so that the next group can safely and respectfully join the table of the Lord.

Communion is a time of reflection and not conversation. Please hold your moment, and don't feel rushed. Remember to respect the experience for those yet to receive.



Safety Reminders from the FELC Worship Team

Now that we have begun worshipping again indoors, there are some reminders to help us stay healthy as a community and respect the needs of all our members.

- Face coverings will continue to be required in the church building, and they will be required in the sanctuary for all attending worship.
- Hand sanitizer will be available for your use at multiple places throughout the church.
- Please be mindful of social distancing. Ushers will seat people as they enter the sanctuary. Please keep two chairs between your party and the next group to ensure a minimum of six feet between family groups.
- Communion will be offered in the gathering space at the end of the service. Please remain seated in the sanctuary until an usher directs you. Once you have received communion, please exit the church.

We all miss the community and each other, but we ask at this time that you do not linger in the gathering space for conversation.





As we celebrate another year at Faith Evangelical Lutheran Church, we are asking you to continue the long history of this congregation's generous financial pledging. We are hoping you will complete your pledge card so we are able to budget and grow in the year of 2021.

The Finance Committee is currently calculating the proposed 2021 operating budget. Obviously, the final details of this budget will be dependent upon the generosity of the congregations pledged giving for 2021

Putting together the yearly budget is a two part process. The first part is relatively easy as this part includes the fixed costs (which comprise the major portion of the budget) to run/maintain our church. These costs remain relatively constant.

The second part of the budget is our commitment to the spiritual ministries that define our church. These ministries include the music programs, children's programs, mission projects, educations experiences and more. Without a vigorous and generous pledge response, spiritual ministry programs are the first to be cut back. Therefore, it is our responsibility to provide the financial support to fund not only the fixed cost, but just as importantly, the spiritual ministries.

Our 2021 goal is to increase both the number of returned pledge cards as well and increasing the giving by 5% over 2020. We prayerfully request **that you personally join with us by increasing your giving by 5% over 2020.** If you have not previously pledged, please prayerfully consider providing a pledge for 2021. A 2021 pledge card is included in hopes that you are able to plan now for next year and for us.


