They serve both as a summation of our Town Hall meeting conversations and who we are as a congregation poised to serve our community.

Congregation Reflections - Spring 2021

Faith Evangelical Lutheran Church is a congregation that has seen much change in the last decade. In the present moment there is the perception that Faith Evangelical Lutheran Church is more hopeful, feels more positive about itself and its ministry and is more welcome and open than it has been in the past five years. This hope for growth is tempered by the declining demographics of both communities and rural, mainline denomination churches like Faith Evangelical Lutheran Church. There is the fear, coupled with that perception, that we will wither at the vine or not be able to continue our present trajectory.

Reflecting back to March and April of 2020 when COVID shut things down, the congregation and leadership narrowed its focus to its three most important values: worship, Faith Formation and congregational connection, all with an eye on safety for the most vulnerable in our midst. These values and foci are reflected in many of Faith Evangelical Lutheran Church's perceived strengths and identity in the community.

Worship is the piece that supports and uplifts people in the congregation whether it is the music, the personality of the Vicar or the Wednesday evening family worship experience. The youth in the congregation feel the church is moving away from just being that "church across from the high school" to a place that is open for all youth and is offering quality relationship-building opportunities. There is a disconnect when it comes to the welcoming face that Faith Evangelical Lutheran Church would like to put forward and the actual practice of being a welcoming congregation.

The community perception of Faith Evangelical Lutheran Church is as a church that is out in the community helping wherever there is a need: food pantry, homeless shelter, free clinic, community VBS. These are some examples of how Faith Evangelical Lutheran Church pulls together around community projects. Our strengths are that we are generous, we have people who will help when asked, and we cooperate well with other community churches and community organizations. Faith Evangelical Lutheran Church also has very dedicated people who do the everyday work of running the church and leaders who are creative and innovative in many areas of church life.

Finally, Faith Evangelical Lutheran Church needs to celebrate the two-year internship we are now completing with Vicar Lily Brellenthin. We feel fortunate and look forward to having Vicar Lily become Pastor Lily. We give thanks for each other's gifts and strengths. We look forward to a future where this pastor and this congregation will meet the needs of our congregation and our community.

Faith Evangelical Lutheran Church is a congregation looking to do God's will for all people. We praise God for giving us leaders, flawed but faithful, to reform the brokenness in our world, our churches and our community.



Community Reflections -Spring 2021

The demographics of Walworth were surprising to the committee in the following ways: the average age of Walworth is lower than expected and much lower than the average of the congregation. The community is poorer than realized, and there are pockets of housing in the community that reflect that poverty. Affordable and available housing is a definite need in the community. The increase of the Hispanic population over the last decade in Walworth reflects the younger age and family size demographic of the community that is not present in the congregation. There is also relatively little mixing between the white and Hispanic communities. Like the majority of Walworth County, Walworth is primarily conservative in its political and world view. The community is more transient than it was ten to fifteen years ago.

Walworth is a community whose past identity (*The Friendly Village on the Square*) does not reflect its present reality. The square is no longer the gathering space that it once was. In addition, the community is divided as witnessed in the multiple school districts that feed into the high school which maintains a distance between Walworth and its surrounding

communities.

Walworth has maintained a slow and controlled growth that has served to keep its identity as a rural community with some manufacturing. The lake, recreation and tourist identity of the Geneva Lake and Delavan Lake communities also influences the community. Like many rural areas and small towns, the high school is still at the center of the community.

The hurts and hopes of Walworth and, therefore, opportunities for ministry include a lack of unity, large areas of separation and a grief that we are not who we used to be. There is a need for leadership to guide the community into a new identity. Young Hispanic families with school-age children is a growing demographic that is somewhat isolated in the community and missing at Faith Evangelical Lutheran Church. The hopes and gifts of the congregation are its generosity and pockets of people who are willing to serve the community. Assets to the community include the new athletic complex at the high school, larger employers like Kikkoman, and established businesses that are generous with the community. The lack of available and affordable housing is being addressed by the community.

Although Faith Evangelical Lutheran Church is simply viewed, by many in the community, as "that church by the high school". There is also the perception that Faith Evangelical Lutheran Church is known for being a community partner in service to the poor and underserved. Faith Evangelical Lutheran Church has been involved in starting the food pantry, the Open Arm free clinic and the area men's homeless shelter. The community meal, 5K run and exercises classes sponsored through the Rec Department are well-known and appreciated by the community.






Thank You
