- The cross reminds us that Jesus died on the cross so we can be forgiven by God for all our sins.
- The heart reminds us that we believe in Jesus with all our heart.
- The rose reminds us of the peace we feel when we believe.
- The sky reminds us of the joy we share with God when we believe.
- The ring reminds us that this joy will never end.

Meet Martin Luther

Martin Luther was a German priest, theologian, author, hymn writer, professor, and Augustinian friar. He was the seminal figure of the Protestant Reformation, and his theological beliefs form the basis of Lutheranism. Luther was ordained to the priesthood in 1507. He came to reject several teachings and practices of the Roman Catholic Church; in particular, he disputed the view on indulgences. Luther proposed an academic discussion of the practice and efficacy of indulgences in his Ninety-five Theses of 1517. His refusal to renounce all of his writings at the demand of Pope Leo X in 1520 and the Holy Roman Emperor Charles V at the Diet of Worms in 1521 resulted in his excommunication by the pope and condemnation as an outlaw by the Holy Roman Emperor. Luther died in 1546 with Pope Leo X's excommunication still in effect.

Luther taught that salvation and, consequently, eternal life are not earned by good deeds; rather, they are received only as the free gift of God's grace through the believer's faith in Jesus Christ, the redeemer from sin. His theology challenged the authority and office of the pope by teaching that the Bible is the only source of divinely revealed knowledge. Luther considered all baptized Christians to be a part of the holy priesthood. Those who identify with Luther's teachings, are called Lutherans, though Luther insisted that Christian or Evangelical were the only acceptable names for individuals who professed Christ. His translation of the Bible into the German language (instead of Latin) made it more accessible to the laity. This had a tremendous impact on both the church and German culture. His hymns

influenced the development of singing in Protestant churches. His marriage to Katharina von Bora, a former nun, set a model for the practice of clerical marriage, allowing Protestant clergy to marry.

Registration is at 12:30 pm. Walk starts at 1:00 pm. The length of the walk varies depending on how far walkers are able to go.




