

In the early verses of Ephesians 4, the apostle Paul writes to the Christians in Ephesus, a city on the Aegean Sea at the mouth of a river and at the intersection of three trading routes. The letter was written about ten years after the church had started. During the early years of this congregation, Jews and Gentiles from several ethnicities and nationalities had come together to form "one body." Paul was aware that they had done well and commended them for their faith and love.

The word "one" appears more than seven times in the first four verses. This reflects the importance Paul gave to being called into the "unity of Christ." He wanted to note that, although many of the church members came from far off, there is "one Lord, one faith, one baptism." This oneness reflects God's gift of reconciliation in Christ.

A second emphasis from Paul was that, as believers, they were to "bear with one another in love." This would require humility, gentleness and patience as each of them practiced their faith. It would require tolerance to "maintain unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace."

A third emphasis was that each person had been given gifts by God and that these gifts were given to increase the whole. Because the Ephesian church was a young congregation and its members were just beginning in their faith journey, their understandings were often tossed to and fro. But as they grew in faith, each person contributed to building up the body of Christ.

The fourth and final emphasis was that by "speaking the truth in love," each person must grow into Christ. This means taking time to learn about one another and their gifts. Knowing these gifts, we can do God's work both within and beyond the faith community. When there are decisions to make or relationships to reconcile, we know to begin with prayer and reflection, always desiring to speak the truth in love — not for our own benefit but for God's glory, that we might become more complete.

As our members and friends gather today, whether face-to-face or online, we are reminded of our calling into "unity in Christ." We come from many places and work in many contexts, and yet we recognize "one Lord, one faith, one baptism."

Whether new to a worshiping community or further along the journey, we realize that humility, gentleness and patience are required both in the good times and especially in times of uncertainty and struggle. God wants us to be more complete through our work. Christ provides the way. The Holy Spirit is with us for guidance and courage. Each of us has been given the gifts to be complete, and through our faithfulness we will grow stronger and work together as one body.

LET US PRAY: LORD, LET THE WORDS OF THE APOSTLE PAUL DWELL IN US DEEPLY. MAY WE EMBRACE THE RECONCILING POWER OF ONENESS WITH CHRIST. MAY THIS ONENESS GUIDE OUR CONGREGATION AS WE LIVE INTO THE NEW REALITIES OF THESE TIMES. AS WE MEET NEW PARTNERS IN MINISTRY, MAY WE TAKE TIME TO GET TO KNOW THEM WITH PATIENCE, HUMILITY AND LOVE. HELP US TO SEE HOW SHARING OUR GIFTS WILL MAKE YOUR WORK EASIER AND MORE FULFILLING WHILE BRINGING ALL OF US CLOSER TO CHRIST. MAY THE BLESSINGS YOU GIVE EACH DAY STRENGTHEN US TO A LIVING, DARING CONFIDENCE IN YOUR GRACE. AMEN.

We will not be able to sing as a congregation, fellowship or eat together as a congregation for almost ten months and said that our primary worship experience for the year will be virtual. My guess is that if all of this were stated as our coming reality we all would have responded "the church will not survive." The words unprecedented and historic have been used to describe 2020. Historic and unprecedented number of Hurricanes, Wildfires, job loss, numbers of infected, sick and dead from a pandemic, response to racial injustice and inequity.

Summary/Highlights of Year

We met during January 2020 to go over and prepare the 2019 actual vs budget and to provide a recommendation to the Council for the 2020 budget.

We met on October 12 and discussed the following items:

- Discussed how we wanted to start the 2021 budget process by encouraging a strong stewardship program
- Agreed to send out a third quarter givings statement in October
- Reviewed the outline of the call process and how it may relate to the 2021 budget
- Discussed pastoral pastoral options and how they would effect the 2021 budget. We sent our recommendation to the Executive Committee.
- Discussed options for our Mission Investment Fund, which ended on 12/8/20.

We met on December 16 and discussed the following items:

- Made a recommendation to remove any accrued interest from the Mission Investment Fund and extend our contract to another four-year deal starting at \$100,000.
- Recommended to the Council to set a minimum checking account balance to the equivalent of one month of budgeted expenditures.

Other highlights:

- Successfully made the transition to ABC Accounting to do our bookkeeping work.
- Penny Gruetzmacher was trained in completing the contributions side of the financial reporting in the church office

Goals/Plans for next year

Send our 6-month and 9-month statements to all congregation members detailing their actual givings vs. pledged givings.

Have meetings prior to the 6-month and 9-month statements to determine current status compared to the budget.

Continue to provide communication to the congregation as to our financial wealth.

Provide support during the transition time with the new pastor and the church office staff.

Summary/Highlights of Year

Adult Education:

Adult education at FELC continues to be volunteer led.

Wine and Word continues to meet monthly and is going strong. There are 8-10 women ordering each book and the group has an average monthly attendance of 8 members.

Social Statements Discussion Group was meeting the 3rd Sunday of every month after worship before the pandemic hit in March. This group is working its way through the ELCA social statements.

Lenten Discussion Group in 2020 was led by Kristi Reierson. This group was able to meet twice before COVID restrictions were put into place.

Children, Youth, and Family Education:

Under the direction of the Director of Children, Youth, and Family Ministry

Faith Formation

Our Faith Formation program uses curriculum from SparkHouse Digital, published by Media 1517. Each student in our program, 1st grade and up, is gifted an age-appropriate Bible from FELC to use during class and at home. 1st-4th graders use the SparkStory Bible and 5th grade-Confirmation use the Here We Stand Lutheran Study Bible-NRSV. We offer classes based on grade level: preK-K, 1st-2nd, 3rd-4th, and 5th -6th. Five to six volunteers are required each week to teach these classes. Each class has a consistent volunteer, or volunteers, who teach them every week fostering good relationships between our students and their teachers. A huge THANK YOU to all our Faith Formation teachers. Faith Formation students and their families were invited to join us for supper each week before class. It takes 3-4 volunteers each week to prep, serve, and clean-up this meal. Another huge THANK YOU to all who helped with Faith Formation meals.

The 2019-2020 Faith Formation year ended abruptly in March when COVID restrictions needed to be put into place. Our last face-to-face class was Wednesday, March 11, 2020. At this time, we had 20 students preK-6th grade from 10 families enrolled in our program. Weekly hand-outs for Faith Formation activities at home were made available throughout the remainder of the school year (June 3). Other things were done to help keep our students connected to the church such as mailing cards, having a drive-thru to pick up Easter packages, and delivering summer fun boxes. The 2020-2021 Faith Formation year started September 16. Precautions such as wearing masks, spreading apart students, not offering a meal, and holding outdoor worship were put into place to keep our students, volunteers, and families safe and healthy. This seems to have been successful and the program is still flurishing. There are 19 preK-6th graders from 9 families enrolled in our program. During the month of December, when we were unable to meet due to the high COVID-19 numbers in the community, mini lessons were made available for families to view together on youtube. These lessons were emailed to families and published on Facebook.

Faithline: Family Faith Formation

We plan about six Faithline: Family Faith Formation classes per year to take place during regular Faith Formation class time. These classes are currently focusing on Faith at Home. Vicar Lily teaches these classes and they are well attended by students and their parents.

Confirmation

During the 2019-2020 school year we had five 7th - 8th grade students enrolled in Confirmation Class. For the 2020-2021 school year we have seven students enrolled in Confirmation. Vicar Lily is continuing to teach Confirmation class using the Here We Stand curriculum. Due to the changes in classes and policies with COVID-19, the one student originally slated to be confirmed in October 2020 is waiting to be confirmed at a later date. In October 2020 six confirmation students attended a team building day retreat at Lutherdale Bible Camp.

CHAOS High School Youth Group

Two to four students continue to meet monthly for CHAOS youth group. This time is spent in conversation and planning activities. Some of our youth were planning to attend a mission trip with youth from Sugar Creek Lutheran Church July 2020; however, this trip was cancelled due to the pandemic.

Other Activities

Live Nativity

In 2020 our Live Nativity took place on Christmas Eve from 4:30-5:30pm. Confirmation students served as the actors. Live animals, live music and a blessing from Vicar Lily completed the experience. About 85 cars drove through the parking lot to view the Live Nativity.

Food, Fun, and Friends

Food, Fun, and Friends days are times for kids to come to church and just have fun. Crafts, games, and projects are usually a part of these days. During 2020 we had three Food, Fun and Friends days: February 3, July 30, and August 19. Vacation Bible School

VBS was cancelled for 2020 due to restrictions from COVID-19. VBS will be hosted at FELC next summer if all goes according to plans.

Other Activities of the Director of Children, Youth, and Family Ministry

- -Monthly meetings with other CYFM Directors in the synod
- -Continued support in creating and distributing the monthly church-wide newsletter
- -Continued support in creating PowerPoint slides for Sunday worship
- -Coordination and support of volunteers for a variety of activities throughout the church
- -Webmaster and assisting with other social media
